Programming

The Youth Services staff was very excited to have the opportunity to resume outreach visits by participating in the Kindergarten Registrations at both Bower Hill and Pleasant Valley this month. Library staff will also be attending several PTSD open house nights in April to hand out information about the library and get families signed up for library cards.

The Best Books for Babies Shower returned to the library after a two-year hiatus. This event is for parents-to-be and new parents, where they could enjoy songs, games, and a discussion about the 2022 "Best Books for Babies" recommended by the Carnegie Library of Pittsburgh. Our staff enjoyed having this opportunity to meet some of our newest little readers and welcome them to the library.

In March, our teens and tweens learned how to make and decorate cake pops, created quilled shamrock art, and attended our new Teen Choice Book Club. In conjunction with the Seed Library, we will be offering many gardening and planting programs this summer, including topics like planting and maintaining your garden, sustaining a pollinator habitat, a plant swap, and how to save seeds.
