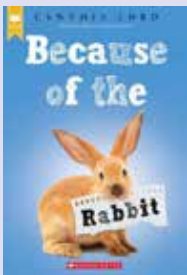

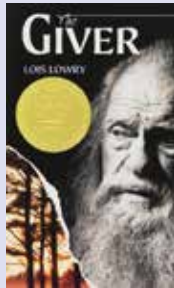

## NEWS FROM THE PTPL ARCHIVES



Library staff and volunteers continue to add more items to the Peters Township Public Library's collection in PA Photos and

Documents. You can now view 24 images from the Donaldson family papers, like the iconic Donaldson's Crossroads intersection image circa 1920. The McMurray, Matthews, Hutchison, Froebe, Roach families, and others have contributed photos viewable at <https://ptlib.org/ptplphotos>.

Also, from PA Photos and Documents, you can listen to the fascinating oral histories conducted as part of the library's Life in Peters Township: An Oral History Project. The interviews with long-time township residents took place from 2003-04. The complete transcripts of the recordings are available to borrow through the WAGGIN catalog.

Progress continues with the grant of \$3,450 from the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission to create a digitization station. The new equipment will scan and provide online access to bound materials that are oversized and/or fragile. We have received the necessary supplies and equipment, and our next step will be establishing the digitization station.

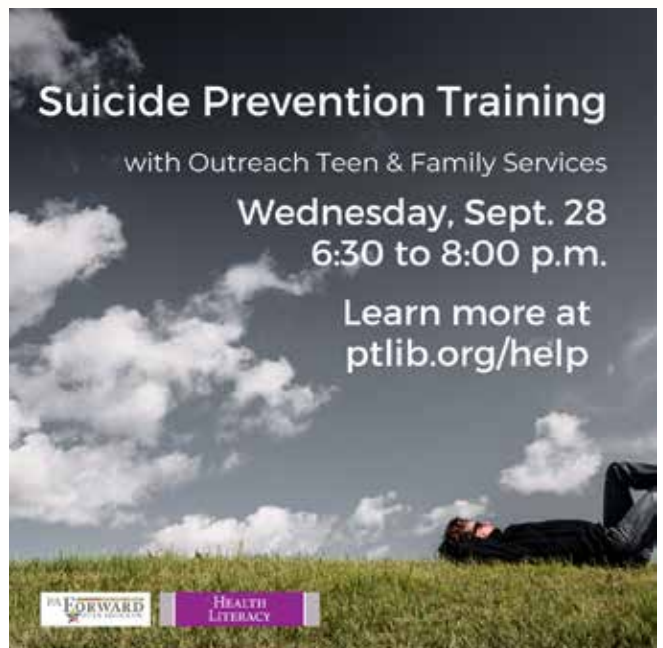

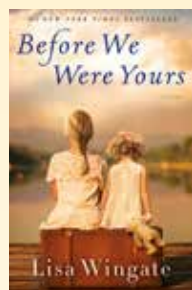

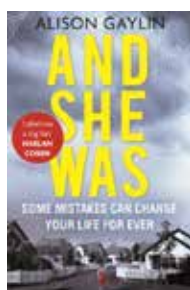
