Library patrons of all ages picked up new-to-them costumes at our returning Costume Swap, created Halloween pour paintings, needle felted 3D pumpkins, and attended a Halloween-themed puppet show by the Pittsburgh Puppet Works. Our inaugural Boos, Brews, and Books event was a great success, with about 85 participants enjoying refreshments from Monday's Brewing and R-EEE-PAS, a library scavenger hunt, tarot readings, and crafts and activities.
