accumulated by the Lybarger family who lived in Peters Township from 1941-2020. Materials document township development, and its businesses, clubs and organizations

including Center Presbyterian Church, the McMurray Lions Club, the Women's Club of Peters Township, the Kiwanis Club of Peters Township, and the Peters Township Public Library.

Biography/History

Samuel Francis Lybarger (1909-2000) was born in Wilkinsburg, Pennsylvania, a suburb of Pittsburgh. Samuel attended the Carnegie Institute of Technology (now Carnegie Mellon University).

Upon graduating from college in 1930, Samuel accepted a full-time job with E.A. Myers and Sons, later known as the Radioear Corporation. He remained at the company until his retirement in 1973, serving as president from 1970-1973. Samuel was an inventor, a lecturer, an author and an industry leader who developed standards for the hearing healthcare field.

Alberta E. Myers (1906-1998), the daughter of E.A. Myers, was born in Indiana and moved with her family to Pittsburgh in 1912. Alberta graduated from the University of Pittsburgh in 1930. She and Samuel married on May 19, 1934. The couple moved to the Old Oak neighborhood of Peters Township in 1941 and their son Edward was born in 1945.

Both Samuel and Alberta were active in the Peters Township community. They were members of Center Presbyterian Church in McMurray. Samuel was a member of the Peters Township Chamber of Commerce, and the McMurray Lions Club. Alberta was a member of the Peters Township Garden Club, served as president of the Women's Club of Peter's Township, and was a founder, contributor and longtime board member of the Peters Township Public Library.

Samuel and Alberta's son Edward (Ed) spent most of his life in Peters Township. He graduated from Peters Township High School in 1963 and attended Thiel College. Like his parents, Ed was active in the Peters Township community. He was a member of the Peters Township Kiwanis Club, serving as president from 1990-1991. After retiring from a career in the hearing aid industry, Ed served as archivist and exhibits curator at the Pennsylvania Trolley Museum in Washington, Pennsylvania. Ed has long taken an active interest in the preservation and promotion of the history of Peters Township. In 2003, Ed was interviewed for the Peters Township Public Library's *Oral History Project*.

Scope and Content Note

The Lybarger family papers document the activities and interests of Samuel F. Lybarger, Alberta E. Lybarger and their son Edward H. Lybarger. The family lived in Peters Township from 1941 until 2020 and was very active in the Peters Township community. The papers document the Lybargers' involvement and interest in local schools and government, Center Presbyterian Church, the McMurray Lions Club, the Women's Club of Peters Township, and the Kiwanis Club of Peters Township.

The papers include documents, township maps, photographs, slides, and audio recordings of Peters Township and its inhabitants, and an extensive collection of newspaper and magazine clippings.
