# **Biography/History**

The Peters Township Ambulance Service began in the summer of 1963 in response to a fatal accident involving a Peters Township firefighter and his two children. Recognizing the need for ambulance service in the Township, Robert McMurray, a Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 764 member, Ralph Barton, Post 764 Commander, along with other VFW members began a community project to provide volunteer ambulance service in the Township.

In the beginning, a converted hearse served as the first ambulance and was driven by a single volunteer. Until the Peters Township Water Department provided the first dedicated ambulance garage, the ambulance was parked at members' homes. Only VFW members were eligible to become volunteer ambulance drivers and attendants until the late 1960s when the VFW membership requirement was lifted. The Peters Township Ambulance Service received recognition as one of the few ambulance services accepting women as volunteers at this time.

In the 1960s, the VFW started an annual membership drive to fund the ambulance service and this membership drive continues today. VFW Post 764 hosts an annual golf outing with proceeds designated for the purchase of medical equipment such as defibrillators.

In 1975, the VFW Ambulance Service began offering EMT (Emergency Medical Technician) certification to its drivers and attendants. Soon after, members of the Peters Township Ambulance Service participated in Washington County paramedic classes. In October 1977, VWF Post 764 dedicated a new ambulance headquarters. The headquarters was built on land donated by Peters Township School District to the Township expressly for leasing to the ambulance service.

As the Peters Township population grew, the ambulance service transitioned from volunteers to career medics and Emergency Medical Technicians. As of 2021, there are thirty paid and volunteer members of the Peters Township Ambulance Service including paramedics, Emergency Medical Technicians, and office staff. The current VFW Post 764 Ambulance Service includes a fleet of three ambulances and a response vehicle.

## **Scope and Content Note**

The Peters Township Ambulance Service collection contains documents the history and evolution of the Township's ambulance service from its establishment in 1963 to its 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 2013.

Records include four press clippings relating to the Peters Township Ambulance Service from 1972, 1992, 1997 and 2013. These clippings were collected and assembled into a collection by PTPL librarian Margaret Dietzer. The collection also includes a program from the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary dinner of the Service in 2003, and three commemorative plates dating from 1973, 1988 and 1993. The plates have an image of the Service's ambulances on the front, and a history of the Service on the back.

#### **Acquisition Information:**

The Archives acquired the press clippings from the local history files of the Peters Township Public Library. The program and commemorative plates were given to the Archives by Assistant Township Manager Kyle Thauvette in 2025.

#### **Custodial History:**

The press clippings were originally part of the Peters Township Public Library's local history files. Prior to being transferred to the Archives, the plates and 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary program were stored in the closet of the Caucus Room in the Township building.
