Abstract: The Peters Township Society of Farm Women records, consisting

of minute books, scrapbooks, and miscellaneous documents, document the formation of the organization in September 1918 and the organization's activities, both social and charitable,

through 1966.

Biography/History

In 1918, as part of the war effort, a man from each Pennsylvania township was selected by the County Director of Agriculture to make reports on crop conditions. These men were also directed to appoint a woman to organize a Society of Farm Women chapter in their area. Ora Bell Bryant accepted an appointment by a representative of the Washington County Department of Agriculture to organize a Society of Farm Women chapter in Peters Township. On September 20, 1918, Bryant invited local women to a meeting in her home in Venetia, Peters Township, and during this meeting they formed the Peters Township Society of Farm Women. The newly formed organization started with 28 members. Over the first 20 years, as many as 70 women belonged to the chapter at one point or another. At the twenty-year anniversary, the Peters Township Society of Farm Women had 17 active and five honorary members.

In a September 1938 *Morning Observer* newspaper article, Mrs. David Rees, the Society's first president, tells the story of the founding of the Society and the history of

the first twenty years of the Peters Township Society of Farm Women. Mrs. Rees reported, "To be statistical, we held more than two hundred meetings, prepared and read maybe 1000 papers, heard possible thirty speakers, made garments for hospitals, carpet rags for the blind, have gone on trips ... held flower shows, ... and made ourselves as useful as we knew how." Rees further stated, "Probably the finest achievement was the organization of a Junior organization."

While the Society of Farm Women of Pennsylvania continues today, the Peters Township chapter of this organization is no longer in operation.

Collection Scope and Content Note

The collection consists of meeting minutes and scrapbooks of the Peters Township Society of Farm Women. It also contains miscellaneous records relating to the Society.

The five bound volumes of meeting minutes document the Society's activities from its formation on September 20, 1918 through April 1966.

The three scrapbooks cover the years 1918-1938 and 1946-1959. The scrapbooks contain Peters Township Society of Farm Women year books, poems, photographs, lists of members, newspaper clippings, bible verses, greeting cards, obituaries and meeting notices.

The minute books and scrapbooks arrived as donations from members of the Trax family whose relatives were members of the Peters Township Society of Farm Women.

Series Scope and Content Note: Series consists of five bound volumes of Peters Township Society of Farm Women minute books. The minutes document installation services, names of charter members, meeting locations, meeting and program hosts, accounting records, and other official actions undertaken by the members.

The minute books also contain information about charitable works, community activities, and a variety of motions discussed and voted on by the members. Minutes include detailed reports from committee chairpersons about various committee activities. The volumes also include a few newspaper clippings, notes, and letters that have been glued onto pages or interleaved.
