Abstract: The Boy Scouts of America Troop 320 scrapbooks document the

membership and activities of Troop 320 during its first 27 years from 1966 to 1993. Founding scoutmaster Dave P. Hull and John Rauscher created the scrapbooks from original content in Hull's photo albums and distributed copies to former scouts and scout

leaders.

Biography/History

Boy Scouts of America Troop 320 received its charter on June 14,1966 under the sponsorship of Trinity United Methodist Church located in Peters Township, Washington County, Pennsylvania. Dave P. Hull, an employee of U. S. Steel's Chemical Division and member of the Peters Township Board of Supervisors, was the founding scoutmaster of the troop and served as its scoutmaster for 25 years.

In the spring of 1993, Trinity United Methodist Church ended its sponsorship of Troop 320. The scouts and parents formed a new troop, Troop 1393. Troop 1393 was sponsored by the Crossroads Church of Christ located in Peters Township. In early 1994, Trinity United Methodist Church re-chartered Troop 1320 under the leadership of Scoutmaster G. Robert Jacobs.

Scope and Content Note

The Boy Scouts of America Troop 320 scrapbooks consist of photocopies of two scrapbooks – Book I and Book II – that were created using original records held by the troop's founding scout master Dave P. Hull. Hull and John Rauscher compiled the original scrapbooks, photocopied them, and distributed copies to former scouts and scout leaders.

The two photocopied scrapbooks contain photocopies of photographs and documents including membership rosters, calendars, meeting records, Eagle Scout awardees, records of troop leaders, scout week celebrations, and other activities. The scrapbooks document Troop 320's first 27 years of existence. Book I documents the years 1966-1976. Book II documents the years 1977-1993.
